A sketch of Rwanda & Shyogwe

Rwanda is almost twice the size of Northern Ireland but has a population of 8 million people. compared to 1.8 million people in N. Ireland.

Over 40% of the population are under 15 years old.

Population expected to double in less than 20 years.

Rwanda has less than 600 doctors (1 for every 17000 people). N. Ireland has 1 doctor for every 400 people.

During the genocide in 1994. around 800.000 Tutsis were killed by the Hutu militia over a period of 100 days. or up to 10.000 people per day! During the troubles in N. Ireland. around about 3500 people were killed in 30 years.

Main exports are tourism (especially visiting the gorilla sanctuaries). coffee and tea. The flag is blue, yellow and green horizontal stripes. with a sun in the top blue stripe.
